It is a way of being, doing and being. But being a medium, the curriculum is also a tool that serves to shape, format and conform.	Developing students' vocabulary with the help of corpus-driven exercises <i>Marta Lacková, University of Žilina</i> The lecture will provide students with various types of exercises (e.g. matching the words and pictures, gap filling, choosing the correct word, mixed letters, classifications of terms, word search, crosswords, etc.) with the aim to extend and improve their vocabulary by increasing the number of words they know and by helping them use the words in a more natural way. English Web Corpus 2015 (enTenTen15) together with the Sketch Engine tools have been employed as the principal source material for the tasks that target vocabulary acquisition.

The lecture will be focused on her life and her story collection Croatian Tales of Long Ago (croatian: Priče iz davnine) originally published in 1916 in Zagreb. She was nominated for the Nobel prize in literature four times and was the first female Corresponding Member of the Yugoslav Academy of Sciences and Arts.
